

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for City of Piedmont

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Even though this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. Between January 1, 2006 and December 31, 2008 we did not monitor or test or did not complete all monitoring or testing for Tap Water Lead and Copper and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

The City of Piedmont did not properly perform the following monitoring:

The City of Piedmont has taken the following corrective actions to prevent monitoring violations from occurring in the future:

Take the required twenty (20) samples plus twenty (20) additional samples, making forty (40) total and report results to Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality on or before December 31, 2009.
